



Independence Day Tour July 4, 2012

At 12:30 p.m., we will leave Knowles to travel 40 miles southeast to the July 4 celebration at Trinity Lutheran Church in Freistadt, the oldest Lutheran church in Wisconsin. Of course, we will have time for an ice cream stop at Confections for Any Occasion in Theresa.

Upon reaching Trinity Lutheran Church, at about 2 p.m. activities include tours of restored and furnished early buildings, food including items baked in a wood-fired brick oven, and Pomeranian music and dancers.

At about 4:30 p.m., we will head back to our starting point, past the home of Gregg and Pam Zangl and through West Bend, a distance of about 30 miles. You will have plenty of time to get home before dark and take in your local fireworks.
