



tion. Thanks for this safety information, Kevin! We'll definitely be checking our wheel bearings before the start of the touring season.

Our next class of the day was "How to make your Model T start quickly like it should" presented by Tod Wirth. Tod began by describing the basics of what's needed for a good running T: Good compression (think rings and valves); good carburetor; good wiring; good timer and of course a good coil box! (Coil boxes were covered a few years ago when John Regan went over that topic thoroughly.)



and having new, properly adjusted points. Tod explained all of this



With the basics established, Tod delved into the coils themselves. His power point presentation had lots of pictures, and he also brought disassembled coils so everyone could see what's inside them. Several diagnostic devices were also on display that he uses to properly calibrate coils,



including a Strobospark tester and an ECCT (Electronic Coil and Capacitor Tester). These testers are used to fine tune coils to put out peak performance. The coils are of primary importance for your T to start quickly and reliably. This includes replacing the original capacitor



thoroughly. His knowledge of Model T mechanics and circuits is well respected in our hobby.

This was a great event! Thanks to Billy Vrana and his crew for hosting and for the tasty lunch. I'd also like to thank our 2 instructors for sharing their knowledge on these important Model T topics. We are fortunate to have them put these presentations on for us today. Thank you Kevin and Tod! It was wonderful!!!

Pete Humphrey announced that Destination Door County tour plans for May 27-29 are in progress. The tour will depart from the Kohler Company Generator Plant parking lot. Twelve Model T's are signed up for the tour, and four rooms are still available at RunAway Lodge in Valmy.

President Pete Humphrey read an announcement sent in by Keith Gumbinger promoting the Homecoming at the Model T Museum in Richmond, Indiana on Saturday, June 3. Model T driving tours are planned prior to the Homecoming on May 31, June 1, and June 2.

Rich Edler will host a "Work Day" at his facility near Waldo on Saturday, June 10. Barb Leonhardt volunteered to plan a "Girl's Day" outing for the same time period.

Billy Vrana discussed the possibility of planning a tour to Symco, Wisconsin.

Jim Rodell, Jr. announced and distributed flyers for "Lilly's Lizzy Tour" planned for Saturday, August 5 from Campbellsport to New Holstein and back. Stops include Toasty Oven Bake Shoppe, Timm House, and Pioneer Corner.

Pete Humphrey announced that Fond du Lac Historical Society has invited the Dairyland Tin Lizzies to bring Model T's to their Ice Cream Social on Sunday, August 13 at Galloway House Museum.

Dave Hjortnaes announced that he is in charge of the Menomonee Falls Historical Society car show at their museum grounds to be held on Saturday, September 16 from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. and invited the Dairyland Tin Lizzies to participate.

Tod Wirth discussed the possibility of planning a tour on September 16 or 17 which would include the Richfield Historical Society Thresheree as the destination.

President Humphrey announced that the spring meeting is the time for election of officers, and asked for nominations. Jim Rodell, Jr. nominated Tod Wirth for president and Ken Lefeber seconded the nomination, but Tod declined. Barb Leonhardt nominated Dave DeYoung for president, who accepted. With no other nominations, a voice vote confirmed all in favor of Dave DeYoung as the new president of Dairyland Tin Lizzies. With no nominations for vice president, secretary, or treasurer and current officers willing to continue service, a voice vote confirmed all in favor that vice president, secretary, and treasurer continue in their roles, followed by a round of applause.

President Humphrey reminded members that it is time to pay dues at the increased rate of \$15.00 per family annually, as decided at the November 6, 2022 meeting.

President Humphrey reminded members that the club has windshield decals available for \$1.25. He also reminded members that MTFCA repair videos are available from him as club librarian.

President Humphrey announced that Gary Prost is in need of a rear floor pan for his 1924 coupe.

Kevin Bruso discussed the possibility of a Model T tour in the Malone area featuring history of the moonshine industry prevalent in the area during Prohibition.

A tentative date of November 5, 2023 is set for our fall business meeting. Incoming President Dave DeYoung will determine a location and details will be announced.

Jim Rodell, Jr. brought up the topic of Dairyland Tin Lizzies Facebook page and expressed his concern that it had grown into something other than a communication tool for our chapter and is not something he would use to promote club tours and local events. The possibility of starting a new Facebook page with different screening options was suggested.

The topic of advertising items for sale within the chapter was discussed. Members were reminded that ads may be posted on our club website or in "The Buzz" newsletter.

President Humphrey adjourned the meeting at 3:20 p.m.


