



St. Patrick's Day Parade- Dundee, Wisconsin

Jerry Fait's parents came from Bohemia (once the western part of what is now the Czech Republc). Jerry was born in 1914 and grew up on a farm near the tiny central Wisconsin town of Milladore. For the past two, years, Jerry has celebrated his birthday by participating in the Dundee, Wisconsin St. Patrick's Day Parade. At this years parade Jerry was to celebrate his 100th birthday, his



grand daughter, Lisa Badini, decided to organize a special way for Jerry to



participate in this years parade. In late February Lisa contacted the Greater Milwaukee Model 'T' club to ask if anyone could provide a Model 'T' to be placed on a decorated float that Jerry could 'ride' in. After some thought and planning I decided that since I own a 100 year old 1914 Model 'T' Ford, that it would be appropriate to volunteer the car for use in the parade.

On Saturday March 15th, my son Tod and I trailered the 'T' up to Dundee. Lisa and her team met us with a flat bed trailer. After loading the 'T' onto the trailer, it was moved into a very large garage to provide some shelter from the wind and cold for Lisa's team



to build a frame on the trailer to display large banners on all four sides of the trailer displaying events that have occurred during Jerry's 100 year of life.



The parade stepped off at noon on March 16th under sunny skies with temperatures at 20 degrees. This parade is noted as the shortest St. Patrick's Day parade in Fond du Lac county (three blocks +/-). There were about 15 units in the parade viewed by a very large crowd wearing the green and enjoying appropriate beverages. Everyone seemed to enjoy Jerry's float with banners on all four sides and the 1914 Model 'T' Ford. Tod and I

very much enjoyed being able to provide an appropriate vehicle for Jerry's birthday celebration as part of this St. Patrick's Day parade.

Celebrating 100 years — old-school style

Jerry Fait has no ties to the Emerald Isle but plans on celebrating his centenary with a few hundred folks - most of whom are also not Irish — at Dundee's St. Patrick's Day parade.

before Born Bolshevik Revolution, World War I, penicillin, television, the Internet and digital cameras, Fait will turn 100 Monday.

Nancy Kopp, town of Jackson, said her father has been in the Dundee parade for the past two years.

"When he comes down the street, everyone starts chanting, 'Jerry, Jerry.' Last year, when he was 99, he rode his scooter standing up, steering with one hand and waving to the crowd with the other,' Kopp said.

Technically, Jerry will still be 99 - the parade takes place at noon Sunday but this year his scooter will be replaced by a float and Fait will sit behind the wheel of a car built the same year he was born — a 1914 Model T Ford convertible.

"Dad will be a star," Kopp said.

Kopp said Jerry's granddaughter Lisa Badini, who owns a cottage in the Kettle Moraine area, got in touch with various Ford collector clubs to see if anyone would be willing to volunteer their vintage vehicle.

Bob Wirth, a member of the Greater Milwaukee Model T Club, stepped for-

"In life you have so many things that you have to do. On occasion, something like this comes along that you want to do," Wirth said.

His son and fellow car collector Tod Wirth, Richfield, offered the loan of his trailer to ferry the vehicle to Dundee.

Kopp said Jerry visited the Model T at Wirth's Colgate home March 8.

The car is in beautiful condition, like it just came off the assembly line," Kopp said.

Fait still lives on his own at River Shores Regency Apartments in West Bend and is known around town.

"He's the guy who comes in and starts dancing around — he likes to show off," Kopp said. "He's in excellent shape — normal heart, normal blood pressure, normal everything.'


Jerry attributes his longevity to staying mentally and physically active and a daily dose of vitamins.

"When I was in high school, I learned about vitamins and minerals and took it to heart. As soon as I could afford it, I bought them," Fait said.

Fait, whose parents came from Bohemia (once the western part of what is now the Czech Republic), grew up on a farm near the tiny central-Wisconsin town of Milladore.

It's surprising that Fait doesn't mind facing the St. Patrick's Day chill in the Kettle Moraine, considering one of his earliest memories — a 2.5-mile walk home from school one blustery day in the 1920s.

'It was snowing a little and the wind was so bad it was blowing snow between the snow banks on the road. About a quarter mile from walking home with my brother (Edwin), I saw a hole in a snow bank and put my head and hands in to warm up a little," Fait said. When he started to feel

comfortable and drowsy, the realization hit him - if he staved where he was, he would freeze to death and summoned Fait strength to continue on his way home.

Fait worked for his room and board in order to go to high school in Wisconsin Rapids, and before his first Misericordia job at Hospital, he took the 140mile journey to Milwaukee to apply for his high-pressure fireman's license.

Fait failed the first time, but checked out a Bailey boiler handbook from the Milwaukee Public library and began to study. When he returned to the city a month later, he aced the

He moved from Misericordia to working for A&P, doing maintenance and boiler work before World War II began. Because of gas rationing — Fait lived on the north side of the city and the A&P warehouse was on the south side — he took a job at AO Smith, where he worked 38 years and retiring at age 65.

Along the way, he married Viola Saeger and had five children.

Jerry will be partying most of the weekend — on Saturday with family memfrom Minnesota. bers Colorado and throughout Wisconsin; on Sunday after the parade and on Monday, with his friends at River Shores.

If you want to cheer on Jerry or wish him Happy Birthday at the St. Patrick's Day Parade, Dundee is about a half-hour north of West Bend on Highway 67 in Fond du Lac County.

Motel T University Work Session

May 3, 2014 - By Keith Gumbinger

Our Model T University Work Session on May 3, 2014 was held at Rich Edler's place. The weather was cool, but nice, and we were lucky it didn't rain.

15 Model T'ers were there some working, some supervising, some watching, and some learning, but we all had fun.

DeWayne Fritz and Jack Leonhardt worked on DeWayne's unrestored '27 Roadster. They installed new bands, packed the front wheel bearings and tightened up the front end in general. They also removed the rear hubs, wheels, and bearings



and found lots of old, hardened grease on the parking brakes and backing plates. Also, the rear wheel bearing sleeves were worn and we need to order parts to finish that job later.

Since DeWayne's '27 Roadster is so original and unmolested, Keith Gumbinger took lots of pictures of some details on the car, such as the original pin striping, the original fender welting, and the upholstery details. On the upholstery, it was noted that there are 12 pleats on both the backrest and the lower cushion. The center pleats are exactly 3 inches wide, and on the backrest the two end pleats vary from 3 to 6 inches wide from top to bottom. The lower cushion has similar measurements. This data will be submitted to The Model T Ford Club International to be used as part of their Judging standards.

Carol Gumbinger finished work on the side curtains for the '26 Roadster owned by Rich Edler and Rich's Brother. This had been started at the last work session, but needed more fasteners ordered for completion.



Jim Hess brought Rich's '24 Fordor in and checked it over. He found the spark lever needed

to be adjusted and did that. Greg Zangl checked the front end on it and tightened it up. Then several of the rest of us cleaned the car real well so it was ready for the Gerrits wedding on May 10th.

At about Noon lunch was ready. It was really a feast. Rich provided Brats and Burgers and his Son grilled them while the rest of us were working. Potato Salad and Beans, etc. rounded out the menu.

Great conversations, Model T knowledge and camaraderie flowed throughout the day. A good time was had by all.
