



Remembering Ray, Part IV

My friend Ray Schuster of West Bend owned a lot of different Model T's, but he also had a 1906 Model N Ford. In 1968, we found out about this car that was located just south of Beloit on the State Line Road and was owned by an old car collector named "Fatty" Folgate. (That's what he called himself.) It was mostly complete. However, the engine was apart, and the front axle, radiator, and hood were removed but they were included. "Fatty" claimed that it was originally the fire chief's car in Monroe, Wisconsin.

Well, Ray thought it looked like an interesting project so he bought it. We loaded it onto the trailer behind my 1967 pickup. There were boxes and baskets containing all of the loose parts.

On the way back to West Bend, we stopped to visit Stan Clapper in Clinton, Wisconsin. He always had some beautiful cars in his shop. (Stan later became the president of the MTFCA in 1974.) He sold me a Model T chassis that had been a dirt track racer in the 1920's near Black River Falls, WI. It had a complete set of Faultless under slung brackets installed on it and included a set of 1926-1927 wire wheels. Stan had painted the wheels 1961 Buick – Sun Valley Cream. I still have the complete under slung chassis, but the wire wheels went on my 1926 Touring in 1971 and have never been repainted.

Ray restored the Model N, and we used to drive it around his yard and driveway. The Model N is right hand drive, so it felt quite different to drive. It had 2 levers on the side and must have operated similar to the first 2500 2 lever 1909 Model T's. Due to its light weight, this little red Ford was quite peppy. The planetary transmission was open and visible if you removed the floorboards. Because it did not have the transmission in the crank case like the Model T, it had a pressure oiler with tubing to the bearings. The excess oil just dripped on the ground. In the "olden days," it helped keep the dust down on the dirt roads, but on Ray's paved driveway it was a little messy.

He traded this car to Dick Janish of Beaver Dam and received in return a 1932 Ford 5 window coupe with the 4 cylinder Model B engine. I wonder where this Model N is today.

Rhubarb Cheesecake

2 cups flour 1 cup butter ½ cup sugar
Mix like pie crust and put into 9x13 pan.
4 cups rhubarb cut up 1 teaspoon flour ¾ cup sugar
Mix flour and sugar with rhubarb and pour into crust. Bake in 375 oven for 15 minutes
2 8oz. cream cheese 3 eggs ¾ cup sugar
Beat cream cheese until fluffy. Mix in sugar and eggs. Pour over rhubarb and bake in 350 oven for 30 minutes or until set.

Webmaster Carol Gumbinger reported on the club website.

Editor Dan Schultz reported on The Buzz, thanking Kendall Gerrits for the article she wrote about the July 4 tour, and announced his goal to publish The Buzz on a regular quarterly schedule.

Old Business:

Dan Schultz reported on "Destination Door County 2010" over Memorial Day weekend which was attended by 14 Model T's and visited Sunshine Peninsula Park and White Dunes Park.

Jack Leonhardt reported on "Wheels and Wings" held on June 20, Father's Day, at Sheboygan County Airport, where he and Barb hosted the club for refreshments at their hangar.

Keith and Carol Gumbinger reported on the July 4 weekend tour to Richland Center.

Kevin Bruso reported on the EAA Fly-in, where the Dairyland Tin Lizzies and the Greater Milwaukee Model T Ford Club provided rides to over 500 people within 4 hours with 18 Model T Fords on July 28.

Bob Wirth reported on the 50th Anniversary Extravaganza of the Greater Milwaukee Model T Ford Club held July 31-August 1 in Pewaukee. The event attracted about 40 Model T's, 70 participants for the banquet, and 120 people for the picnic.

Paul Brodtke reported on the Christel Ford 100 year celebration held July 31-August 1 in Valders.

Jim Rodell, Jr. reported on "Model T Day" held August 21 at Wisconsin Automotive Museum in Hartford. Approximately 40 Model T's attended. Jim thanked those who attended and helped run the event. Model T rides were given to about 150 people. The food stand, organized and run by Dan & Phyllis Schultz, gained \$153.12 for the club treasury. Mickey's Frozen Custard donated \$50.00 to the club in thanks to our club for inviting them to the event.

Jim Rodell, Sr reported on the "Raspberry Tour" he organized on September 12 which included visits to the Fire Museum, the Milwaukee Light Engineering Society train park, and the Jackson Historical Society museum.

Duane Nicholson reported on the benefit for his granddaughter, Clarabear, held October 17. The event included Model T rides provided by club members. Duane shared the sad news that Clarabear did not

survive her illness. Carol Gumbinger moved to donate \$50.00 from the treasury to the family. Sandra Stock seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The tour organized by Sharon Venski of the Greater Milwaukee Model T Ford Club to Union Grove was cancelled because of the bad weather on October 24. The tour will be rescheduled for 2011.

New Business:

Members indicated the desire for a club Christmas party to be held in January, 2011. President Rodell asked Diane Scheid to reserve a location for the party. Sandra Stock volunteered to bake hams for the party. Other members are asked to bring a potluck dish. Jim Rodell, Jr. moved that the club treasury be used to pay for expenses such as facilities rental, hams, and beverages. Jim Hess seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The club will not have a booth at the Model A club winter swap meet to be held February 27. .

Carol Gumbinger expressed her desire to organize a multi-day regional tour and shared her tentative plans to host the tour in August, 2011, headquartered at Cedar Valley Center northwest of West Bend. Jim Rodell, Jr. moved to approve her tentative plans, giving her the endorsement of the Dairyland Tin Lizzies. Kevin Brusco seconded the motion. Motion carried. Keith Gumbinger will begin promotion of the event after itinerary and fees are determined.

The spring business meeting is scheduled for April 10, 2011 at Aiden O'Reilley's pub and restaurant in Allenton.
