Covered Bridge Tour - October 2, 2021



The morning of October 2nd dawned cloudy but comfortable as we met in Slinger for Jim and Colleen Rodell's Covered Bridge Tour. Our meeting place and the first destination on the tour was the Schleisingerville to Slinger Historical Museum. It was a good turnout with 10 cars. Present at today's tour were Jim & Colleen Rodell, Kevin Brusco, Markus & Julie Geoffrey, Tod, Bob & Alice Wirth, Rock Zangl, Denis & Melodie Pulvermacher, DeWayne Fritz & Diane Scheid, Pete & Shelly Humphrey, Rob & Pat Maasch and Dave & Gail DeYoung with Gordy Sharapata.



The Slinger Historical Museum had been a destination (and a starting point) the previous year so their exhibits were familiar to many of us. Nonetheless, their displays of all things of local interest are always a treat. The primary focus here today was the Schaefer Pipe Organ, which was in the final stages of refurbishment. Though we could not hear it play this day, it was

scheduled to be up and running the following week.



After just less than an hour at the museum, we were on our way, headed east toward Cedarburg. Along the way we passed over the covered bridge on Lime Ridge Road which crosses Stoney Creek. Continuing on our Country roads we arrived at Covered Bridge Park in Cedarburg.



The park features a rare bridge built in 1876. The original span measured 120 feet long and 12 feet wide. The source of building materials was pine logs, cut and milled near Baraboo, Wisconsin. The timber and planks were then hauled to the Cedar Creek site and assembled. It is built with 3-inch-by-10-inch planks fastened by 2-inch hardwood pins. There are no nails or bolts!

After a useful life of 85 years, it was retired when a modern bridge was built alongside. It is now open to pedestrian traffic only. This was the perfect site for a morning refreshment break consisting of juice, milk, cookies and kringle. Thank you Jim & Colleen!

It was time to move on, and a short drive brought us to downtown Cedarburg and the Cedarburg History Museum. This museum, which opened in 2015, features both permanent and temporary rotating exhibits of local interest. We found the general store to be quite impressive and free cups of craft root beer were being offered to guests.



After the museum, we were free to explore downtown Cedarburg and find lunch on our own. It was Octoberfest and the streets and sidewalks were busy. It would have been easy to spend the whole afternoon exploring the shops along the main street, but another nearby museum was in our plan.

We drove a few miles out of town to the Jonathan Clark House Museum located at the corner of Bonniwell and Cedarburg Roads in Mequon. This is a beautifully preserved architectural and historical site. The house was built in 1848 and was home to Jonathan and Mary Clark and their eight children. It was not only their home but also served as a community meeting place during a time when early settlers were developing the government of the township. We enjoyed a guided tour of the house and got the flavor of life in the area in the 1850s.



We left the Clark House at around 3pm and started back west, stopping at Witte's Vegetable Farm Market for some fresh produce (and cheese curds!). Along the way we also drove through Lamm's Garden Center and crossed Cedar Creek over the historic iron bridges which had been moved there.



The tour brought us back to Slinger. A final stop at Jim's Place for some ice cream capped off the day.

President Humphrey asked if there were any corrections to the April 10, 2021 Minutes. No corrections were needed so President Humphrey asked for a motion to have the April 10, 2021 minutes approved as written. Carol Brodtke moved, Melodie Pulvermacher seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Vice President Kevin Brusco was not able to attend and had no business to report.

Secretary Rodell was not able to attend. However he did pass along a reminder that the Dairyland Tin Lizzies club is a chapter of the MTFCA. As a chapter of MTFCA, it is advised that all DTL members also be members of MTFCA for insurance purposes.

Treasurer Lefebber provided a financial statement from April 10, 2021 – October 16, 2021 showing a beginning balance of \$778.47 and an ending balance of \$983.24. Keith Gumbinger moved to accept the Treasurer's Report. Dave DeYoung seconded the motion. The motion carried.

Newsletter editors Pete and Shelly Humphrey reported on "The Buzz", and are interested in receiving stories about member projects to include in future issues.

Webmaster Carol Gumbinger reported that Hemming will discontinue hosting club websites. They hosted our website at no cost to us for 20 years. Thank you Hemmings! Our new website is www.Dairylandtinlizzies.com. This update will cost \$160 for 3 years of hosting and will be taken from our club dues. The new hosting arrangement will allow for much greater content capacity on our site. This will be helpful as the club grows and we add more photos, Buzz issues and other elements. Carol also reminded members to send pictures of their cars to her to post on the website. That includes members that recently purchased additional Model T's.

OLD BUSINESS:

Ken Lefebber reported on the May 1st Spring Shakedown tour. It began at Rich Edler's home with 9 cars and included stops at the Kohler Arts Preserve, the Aviation Heritage Museum at the Sheboygan airport and the Johnsonville Marketplace. All 9 cars finished the tour, ready for the upcoming tour season.

Diane Scheid reported on the Destination Door County tour held May 29th-31st. This was the largest group that we've had for this nearly annual tour, with 17 cars. We filled 15 rooms at the Runaway Lodge and needed 2 additional rooms at the Innlet Motel in Jacksonport, about 5 miles north. The tour included stops at Hartman's Bakery, Old Orchard Antique Mall, and the Ellison Bluff County Park.

Pete Humphrey and others who attended reported on the Get into Dodge County tour that Jim and Colleen Rodell hosted on July 3rd. Stops included Ledge Park, Fox Lake historical museum and Edwin Brix vineyard.

President Humphrey requested a report on EAA Airventure from those who attended. It was reported that over 1,000 rides were given and although there were cutbacks from previous year, it was still a great time.

President Humphrey reported on Jim and Colleen Rodell's Covered Bridge tour held October 2nd. The tour started at Schleisingerville Museum in Slinger with 10 Model-T's. Stops included the Covered Bridge Park, Cedarburg History Museum with lunch on your own in downtown Cedarburg and a visit to the Jonathan Clark House Historical Museum in Mequon.

NEW BUSINESS:

Keith Gumbinger reported that the MTFCA finances are in good shape, the new Executive Director is Rachel Hughes, and that 3 new chapters have joined the MTFCA. Also the MTFCA International tour next year is planning on visiting the MTFCA Museum in Richmond, Indiana.

Barb Leonhardt volunteered to book this same space for our spring meeting which is to be held on Saturday, April 23rd, 2022 at 2pm.

With no further business to discuss, Carol Brodtke moved to adjourn the meeting. Denis Pulvermacher seconded the motion. The motion carried and the meeting was adjourned at 3:31p.m.

The Dairyland Tin Lizzies chapter invites you to join the “Wonderful Wisconsin” MTFCA 2022 National Tour to be held June 19-24, 2022. Tour headquarters will be the Radisson Hotel in Fond du Lac, Wisconsin. We look forward to sharing the quiet country roads, beautiful scenery, history and cuisine which make southeast Wisconsin a great place to live, visit, and enjoy Model T’s!

Tour Highlights:

Saturday, June 18th and Sunday, June 19th: Registration will be open. Pick up your tour packets and explore the city of Fond du Lac on your own. Our week of fun kicks off Sunday afternoon with a meet and greet Model T car show. A BBQ will be served in the evening and is included in tour fee.

Monday, June 20th: Tour to the Road America Racetrack in Elkhart Lake. This world-renowned road course has hosted the Nascar Cup Series, Xfinity, Indy Cars, SCCA and many other highly coveted races. The track is situated on 640 beautiful acres. An official Pace Car will lead our T’s onto the track and guide us for two laps around this 4-mile, 14 turn road course. Admission to Road America and lunch are included in tour fee.

Tuesday, June 21st: Tour south to the Schleisingerville to Slinger historical museum. Drive the winding roads through the Kettle Moraine with the opportunity to visit Holy Hill. Lunch will be served in Hartford’s beautiful and historic Chandelier Ballroom. We will visit the Wisconsin Automotive Museum, home of the world’s largest collection of Hartford-built Kissel automobiles and trucks. Lunch and admission to museum included in tour fee.

Wednesday, June 22nd: Tour along Lake Winnebago, making a stop at a local creamery that doesn't have cows. We will tour to the Wade House, a restored 1850’s stagecoach inn between Fond du Lac and Sheboygan. This 48-acre site includes a working sawmill, a working blacksmith shop, a carriage museum and more. Enjoy a scenic horse-drawn carriage ride on the grounds. Museum admission and lunch are included in the tour fee.

Thursday, June 23rd: Tour along the eastern edge of Horicon Marsh to Mayville. Hidden gem, Mayville boasts two historical societies to visit, Mayville Limestone School Museum and Hollenstein Wagon Factory Museum. Explore Horicon Marsh Visitors Center and a private car collection featuring Ford flathead V-8’s. A picnic lunch of German bratwurst and hamburgers will be available for purchase at the Pavilion on the bank of the Rock River.

Friday, JUNE 24 Tour north to the Experimental Aircraft Association Aviation Museum in Oshkosh. This museum shows the progression of flight from the very beginning through modern times. Visit Basler Aviation, a facility specializing in DC-3 and C-47 airplane restorations. Museum admission and lunch included in tour fee.
